ANABAPTISM AND THE FUTURE OF THE ACCA

Anabaptism at 500, June 28, 2025

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- Some of my thoughts
- Then we'll hear your thoughts

- We are moving closer and closer to American evangelicalism
- Anabaptism does not have the resources to satisfy the felt needs of Christians in evangelical America:
 - Not sacramental
 - No real Tradition (as opposed to minor traditions)
 - Insufficient grounds for authority
 - The Anabaptist stress of "plain reading" of the Bible minimizes theological depth.
- In reality and in perception, "Anabaptism" is too captive to tired-out "buggies and bonnets."

- ACCA evangelicalism needs ACCA Anabaptism.
- ACCA evangelicalism is heart religion.
- ACCA Anabaptism is life religion.
- In the 1800s, this meant authentic Christianity. There is no reason why it cannot mean that today.
- But we need each other to prevent a superficial witness on one hand and a superficial life on the other.

- It likely will not satisfy the desire for "high church" liturgy.
- But ... it is more sacramental than we have come to believe.
- Original, 1500s Anabaptism was very Zwinglian in its approach to baptism and communion: "mere symbolism."
- But ... Anabaptist sacramentalism of daily life.
- And Froehlich and Anabaptism stressed that <u>adult</u> baptism implies something actually happens in baptism.

- · Anabaptism is not as long-term history-minded as other faith traditions.
- Anabaptism is a faith tradition that honors the Great Tradition.
 - Early Anabaptists quoted and admired early church fathers and sought to demonstrate that they were most faithful to the early church's interpretation of apostolic teaching.
 - Anabaptism has compelling stories, habits of mind and behavior, and even theological wisdom accessible to us today:
 - Dirk Willems
 - Martyrs Mirror

 The Biblical grounds for authority in the ACCA is the presence of the Spirit. There are compelling theological, exegetical grounds for that. Apostolic succession and magisterial power may be overrated.

- So many voices, so many ideas, so much confusion.
- We have thoroughly adopted the Anabaptist emphasis on a plain reading of the Biblical text.
- Result: strong anti-intellectualism in the ACCA.
- But it needn't be so:
 - Early Anabaptist leaders concerned mainly about sophisticated attempts to get around the plain reading.
 - Early church leaders
 - Froehlich himself
 - ACCA "church fathers"
 - The Elders Teaching Resource
- And "plain-reading" can act as a guardrail against mere data accumulation.

- The "buggies and bonnets" problem is real, on the ground and in our imagination.
- "The crazy people" is real.
- The <u>abuse</u> of history to fight current battles:
 - Selectively quoting Froehlich and other sources
 - Ignoring historical context
 - A means to glorify us
- We need to get over fear of our own past in order to properly learn from our past

BESIDES, EVERYONE EVENTUALLY COMES AROUND TO ANABAPTISM

- Believer's baptism
- Voluntary church membership
- "Separation of church and state"
- Separation from the world (immorality; consumerism; individualism; social and political media; anger and protest)
- Nonviolence
- Self and Church discipline
- Community vs individualism
- Communal identity vs individual identity: a place in the world
- Anabaptists were there first!
